My precious sheep:

We have gone through another season of Lent (2018). Throughout this season I preached through the seven last words of Jesus spoken from the cross (abbreviated – The Seven Last Words). These were the last words Jesus spoke before He died – and He uttered them while hanging on the cross, while in excruciating pain, humiliated, and defeated. Other famous last words have been passed down to us in history. Most recently David Cassidy (of the Partridge Family) who passed away in late 2017 said before he died, "So much wasted time."

Jesus Christ uttered seven sayings from the cross (seven being the number of perfection in the Bible) and these sayings provide us a window into His soul. His first saying from the cross was a prayer to God the Father and He prayed that His enemies might be forgiven for crucifying Him. In Luke 23:34 it reads, "Jesus said, "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing." The accent here

falls on the word "what" and not "know." Surely, they "knew" that they were crucifying Jesus of Nazareth; but they did not know "what" they were doing, that is, that they were crucifying the Lord of glory (1 Cor 2:8) – indeed, the great I AM (John 8:58)! Jesus taught to love our enemies (Matt 5:43-48) and He embodied that teaching on the cross. His second word from the cross was to the repentant thief (according to early church tradition his name was Dismas). This thief (unlike the unrepentant thief) showed true contrition for his sin and admitted that he deserved the penalty of death for his sin (Luke 23:41 – all of us sinners deserve death, Romans 6:23). Then he placed his faith and trust in Jesus and the Lord said to him, "Truly I tell you, today you will be with Me in paradise" (Luke 23:43). This promise is true for every person who puts their faith and trust in Jesus, that is, when all believers die, we will immediately be with Jesus in paradise. The Greek word for paradise means "garden"; I imagine something like a Thomas Kinkade painting. Heaven is like a garden where you'll be with Jesus, the most loving person in existence. Now that reward is worth giving Him your all in this life! His third saying on the cross was a word to His mother Mary where He entrusted her into the care of the Beloved Disciple (probably John the Apostle). Jesus said, "Woman, here is your son," and to the disciple, "Here is your mother" (John 19:26-27). Even while hanging on the cross, Jesus did not neglect the duties of a son to His aging parent, and showed that He obeyed the fourth commandment to honor your parents (Ex 20:12; Deut 5:16).

The fourth word that Jesus uttered from the cross was the central word and the most solemn. He spoke it after three hours of darkness. The darkness represented the separation that occurred between God the Father and Jesus His Son. Because in that moment on the cross Jesus became sin (2 Cor 5:21) and a curse (Gal 3:13) for us God had to turn His back on Jesus and so for the first and only time in all of eternity God the Father broke fellowship with His Son Jesus Christ. Therefore, Jesus said, "My God, my God, why have You forsaken Me?" (Matt 27:46; Mark 15:34). Please understand. When Jesus said, "Why have you forsaken Me?" it was not simply because He *felt* forsaken; He said it because He *was* forsaken. Literally, truly and actually God the Father abandoned His one and only Son for those three hours. This is the depth that Jesus suffered on the cross (and the Father suffered too) because of His great love for us. The fifth saying on the cross was, "I am thirsty" (John 19:28). This has a two-fold meaning, I believe. First, it refers to the fact that Jesus was literally thirsty. He was severely dehydrated on the cross and thus He wanted a drink of water. However, I believe there's a deeper meaning and that after being separated from God the Father for those three long hours Jesus was spiritually thirsty and He longed to return to fellowship with God. The sixth saying on the cross was a word of victory when Jesus said, "it is finished" (John 19:30). This statement was a summary of His whole ministry and work on the cross. This statement "it

is finished" is one word in the Greek (te-te-le-stai) and it means it was finished, is still finished, and always will be finished. And the seventh and final saying on the cross was a prayer of faith and trust to God the Father that He would receive Jesus' Spirit into His arms after He breathed His last and died. Jesus said, "Father, into Your hands I commit My Spirit" (Luke 23:46). Those same hands are waiting to embrace you someday when you die. When we were born, we were brought into this world through a physician's hands; likewise, when we die (as Christians), we will be born into the next life through the Great Physician's hands. Amen! And glory to God!


I encourage you to continue to study and reflect on these last words of Jesus. What will your last words be? For Jesus they were words of forgiveness; they were words of love and care for the repentant thief and His mother Mary; they were words that show us the depth of His sacrifice in being separated from God; they were words of a life and ministry lived well for God and a final prayer of trust that He would be received into God's everlasting hands. May we be Christians who forgive and love and sacrifice and trust in our Heavenly Father (our Abba)!
