My precious sheep:

I am writing this newsletter as our nation is in turmoil. Protests are spreading across the US in the wake of the death of George Floyd. These protests have reached Salt Lake City, and some have turned violent. Our nation is divided. How can we be united as Americans? Personally, I don't believe we will ever achieve true and lasting unity in America (or in any other nation for that matter). I do believe, as Christians, we should support justice and equality for all American citizens. We should listen sympathetically & empathically to other people who differ from us in race and socio-economic status. But even with our best efforts, I don't believe we will achieve true unity and peace. I'm not being pessimistic. It's due to our sinful nature.

My new sermon series for the summer of 2020 is the book of Ephesians. Do you know what the main theme of this book is? It is unity! True and lasting unity can only come about through the church of Jesus Christ and it's based upon the work of the Trinitarian God. Now I don't mean to suggest in the foregoing that I am going to get political in our reading of Ephesians. Every pastor struggles with finding the right balance in engaging our current political discourse. If you feel I am doing a poor job in either direction, let me know by phone or email. I will listen. My intention with the book of Ephesians is simply to look at it as we would any other biblical book. First, to look at it in its original context. Then, to apply it to our walk with Christ today. To allow the Holy Spirit to speak to us through Ephesians concerning its spiritual RICHES. The riches we have in Christ is a key theme. But the most salient theme of Ephesians is unity.

Let me explain. Ephesians begins (from 1:1-2:10) by explaining and celebrating the fact that we as Christians have been united with God through the atoning work of His Son Jesus Christ on the cross. Ephesians speaks of our salvation in Christ as vast riches that we have IN HIM (Eph 1:3; 2:7). This is the vertical dimension of unity. First and foremost, every human being has the need to be united with God (to be reconciled with God). Because of our evil nature (the flesh) and because of the sins we have committed we are divided against God. Being united to God through the gospel is the only hope of ever being united with our fellow man (think here the Double lovecommandment: FIRST love God; THEN love your neighbor). This is why I believe all attempts at unity in this world according to secular governments and organizations will never achieve true and enduring harmony. It's because there's no accountability. As Christians, we have accountability to God in our duty to be united with our fellow man on account of our salvation experience of being united with Him – of being born again into God's family! Ephesians is a Trinitarian book. We have been united with God through the gospel due to the fact that the Trinitarian God (Father, Son, and Holy Spirit) has worked in unity for our salvation. We will see this in Ephesians. First, from eternity past, the Trinitarian God is united; then we sinful human beings are united to this Trinitarian God through faith. Then, God desires that we strive for unity in the church, which consists of Jew and Gentiles -God's new humanity IN CHRIST (Eph 2:11-3:21).r



"The LORD is my light and my salvation – whom shall I fear?
The LORD is the stronghold of my life – of whom shall I be afraid?" Psalm 27:1

Ephesians chaps 4-6 consists of various admonitions to unity in the church. In 4:1-6, the word "one" occurs six times alone, thus emphasizing God's desire for His people to be united. Let's face it: there's division in the church as there is in the world. Christians get angry, hold grudges, harbor unforgiveness, divide and leave churches. Most of Paul's letters were written to divided churches. Nothing's changed in 2,000 years.

There's division in families too – between spouses, with children, and at work with our bosses. Paul addresses these relationships in Eph 5:21-6:9 and stresses mutual submission as key (Eph 5:21). The source of disunity in the family, in the church, and ultimately in every human relationship is the unseen world of spiritual darkness, which is why Paul ends Ephesians with the famous armor of God passage (Eph 6:10-20). Scripture says plainly, "For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms" (Eph 6:12). How can our world ever arrive at true unity among men and women when it fails to even acknowledge this existence of the world of demons, let alone their influence on human beings?

This newsletter is just a taste. But can you now see how unity is a theme that runs like a thread (beginning with Eph 1:10) that ties the whole epistle of Ephesians together? I am excited to embark on this journey with you as we walk through the book of Ephesians, verse-by-verse. Walk is a fitting image, as this metaphor is used in Ephesians to describe our relationship with God. Therefore, my title for this sermon series is: "Walking with the Trinitarian God as ONE."
