My precious sheep:

This month of July we celebrate the birth of America and our Independence as a nation (July 4, 1776). Happy Birthday USA! Do you know how old our country is? Do the math. July 4, 1776 -July 4, 2020 - America is 244 years old. As Christians, we should be thankful for our great nation. Many American soldiers have bled and died so that we can enjoy the freedoms we do. They paid the ultimate price - Jesus said there's no greater love (John 15:13). Let's be respectful and grateful. Yet, there are some people in our country who, to this very day, feel as though the promise of independence and freedom which our nation cherishes has not been experienced equally. I am speaking of our African-American neighbors. The death of George Floyd back in May has reignited the issue of race-relations in America. Last month, many Americans recognized what is called "Juneteenth," a portmanteau of June and nineteenth, which celebrates the day that slaves in America were emancipated on June 19, 1865 in Galveston, Texas. I am not trying to get political. Just imagine how it would feel if the promise of freedom had been delayed for you for 89 years (from July 4, 1776 to June 19,1865)? And then for another 99 years of segregation in the South (until the Civil Rights Acts of 1964)? We should be empathetic to the stories and experiences of our African-American neighbors. Let us listen (James 1:19) and love (James 2:8). The latter Scripture states that "Love your neighbor as yourself" is the royal commandment of the Bible. There's some other issues I would like to discuss. The first concerns our citizenship. We are American citizens and I believe we should be proud of this. Yet, this will always be secondary to our citizenship in heaven.

CONT'D...

Our first allegiance is to the eternal Kingdom of Christ. Philippians 3:20 states, "But our citizenship is in heaven. And we EAGERLY await a Savior from there, the Lord Jesus Christ." Are you "eagerly" awaiting the return of Jesus Christ? Or are you too comfortable living the American dream? If Jesus were to return tomorrow, would you welcome Him with open arms, or would you say, "Lord, can You please come back later?" It's a question worth praying about. We are sojourners in this world. It says of Abraham in Hebrews 11, "By faith he made his home in the promised land like a stranger in a foreign country; he lived in tents, as did Isaac and Jacob, who were heirs with him of the same promise. For he was LOOKING FORWARD to the city with foundations, whose architect and builder is God" (Heb 11:9-10). Are you "looking forward" to this heavenly city of God (cf. Heb 12:22, 28)? It's the same question as "eagerly." The other issue I want to consider is freedom (independence). We have precious freedoms in America! Some of these freedoms are speech, religion, movement - the freedom to own private property, the freedom to pursue any education and job we want to, etc. Yet, many Americans, probably many Christians, do not live as free people but as slaves to their sin. The Bible is clear that outside the power of Christ we are all slaves to sin. Paul the Apostle states in Romans chap 7, "We know that the law is spiritual; but I am unspiritual, sold as a slave to sin. I do not understand what I am doing. For what I want to do I do not do, but what I hate I do...this I keep on doing!" (Romans 7:14-15, 19).



"The LORD is my light and my salvation – whom shall I fear?
The LORD is the stronghold of my life – of whom shall I be afraid?" Psalm 27:1

I can hardly imagine any Christian with whom these words do not resonate at least some, concerning the struggle each has with their own sins. How do we break free from our bondage to sin? Paul the Apostle concludes this section of Romans 7 with that grand declaration in Romans 8:1, "Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus!" Being "in Christ Jesus" is the key. Freedom comes by knowing that no matter how many times you keep messing up, God still loves you and you are forgiven. Grace leads to freedom. We are learning more about the grace that is ours in Christ, our spiritual blessings, our rich inheritance in Christ, from our study of Ephesians chap 1 (Eph 1:3-14). Let us keep praying that God, by the power of the Holy Spirit, would enlighten the eyes of our hearts to see these blessings in Christ (Eph 1:17-19). We learn from the pages of American history that some African slaves were unaware of their freedom after the end of the Civil War. The news had not reached them and thus they were still living as slaves. For others, even after the news arrived, they were so familiar with a life of bondage, that freedom did not come to them for a while. This is the plight of many Christians today. Many Christians simply do not know the news, the GOOD news of the gospel, that they are free in Christ (Gal 5:1). Many do not take the time to study and reflect on the gospel according to the Bible. Ignorance keeps them in bondage. For other Christians, they understand the news, but think and feel it is too good to be true, that salvation can't be full and free, and perhaps worry about exploiting God's grace (cf. Rom 6:1; 1 Pet 2:16). Do you want true freedom this Independence Day? Have the courage to believe that every sin of yours - past, present, and future - has been nailed to the cross (Col 2:14) and live the rest of your earthly life with peace & joy knowing that you are God's FRIEND and CHILD (John 15:15 & Gal 4:6-7)! Grace and Peace.

who gave their all.


Someone made the great sacrifice, they died for their country and their death was not in vain.
