My precious sheep:

In Ephesians 3:18 Paul the Apostle tells us to pray that we may, "have power, together with all the Lord's holy people, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ." The love of Jesus Christ for us, unworthy sinners, has limitless boundaries; according to this verse, there's more to grasp in its width and height. What do you pray for? If anything, I encourage you to pray for this! And throughout this issue of the Link, I want to try and help you understand these boundaries in greater measure by offering some Scriptural insights. I'm not done with Christmas yet. The birth of Jesus Christ is so monumental I want to keep talking about it and exploring its depths. There are two main Scriptures that we often turn to at Advent. I want to quote these for you, point out some insights, and build on them. The first Scripture is taken from Isaiah. It's Isaiah 9:6. It reads, "For TO US a child is born, TO US a son is given, and the government will be on His shoulders. And He will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace." This verse is familiar because it has these four wonderful (and lofty!) titles for Jesus Christ bestowed on Him at birth. But notice the words I highlighted: TO US. Jesus was born to us - for us. Interesting. The next main Scripture is Luke 2:11. I preached this Scripture at our Christmas Eve service. This is where the angel of the Lord (possibly Gabriel) is announcing the birth of Jesus to those lowly shepherds tending their flocks at night. And the angel says, "Today in the town of David a Savior has been born TO YOU; He is the Messiah, the Lord." Again, we encounter these words: TO YOU. Jesus was born to you - for you. What's the significance of this? Well think of when your children were born. I have two sons. They were born for me and for my wife - because we are their parents.

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
Children are born into a family for their parents. But, Jesus was NOT born for the benefit & blessing of His earthly parents (Joseph and Mary). Jesus was NOT born even for His own life. Jesus was born for one reason and one reason only: to die on a cross for the salvation of the world. The name given Him at His birth was Jesus which means, "The LORD saves/is salvation." Read Matthew 1:21. Jesus was born for the benefit of mankind. It was not for His benefit that He was born. When Jesus left His throne in heaven and came to earth, His life didn't get better. Actually, His life got much worse. My point is He's the only person who never lived for Himself! He only lived for other people. To serve us. To sacrifice for us. To die for us. And even though He lived a selfless life, from birth to the grave, most people throughout history, and still today, have rejected Him and hate Him. To quote Francis Chan, that's "Crazy love." Who else in human history ever lived such a selfless life? Can you imagine having a baby, knowing that baby would have no future life in this world? Jesus never had His own life. He never got married. He never had any children. He never owned a home; He was homeless (Luke 9:58). He never owned any possessions. He never took a vacation. He never dreamed of retirement or having grandchildren. And at the end of His life, He suffered a painful and shameful death on the cross for crimes He did not commit (He was innocent). If this was the life you lived, how would it make you feel? Would you even want to live? Isaiah the prophet said of Jesus, "He was despised and rejected by mankind, a man of suffering, and familiar with pain" (Isaiah 53:2). Would you wish this life on anyone? And yet, Jesus lived this life FOR US. He knew in heaven, before He became a man, that this was the life He was destined to live, and He chose to come to earth anyway. Why would Jesus do that? Four letters: L-O-V-E. This is TRUE love! The word "love" is the most overused word in the English vocabulary. People use this word frivolously every day, and its meaning is light years away from what love truly means, which is what Jesus embodies. You find me anyone else on this planet who's willingly to live the life Jesus lived, and I'll call them loving. Why am I talking about all of this? I want to help you see the great lengths Jesus went to be in relationship with you. I want to help you see how greatly He loves you, so that you will greatly love Him in return. As you know, I am passionate about making disciples in the church, because this is the marching orders for the church given by Jesus Himself (Matt 28:18-20).



"The LORD is my light and my salvation – whom shall I fear? The LORD is the stronghold of my life – of whom shall I be afraid?" Psalm 27:1

I think the best motivation to live for Jesus as an obedient disciple is to know how greatly He has loved you. Let all of us (myself included) love Jesus more sacrificially in 2021! Below are two pictures. The first is what a first-century manger probably looked like. It looks like a little box cut out of stone. To me it looks like a little coffin for a baby. Could this be what the angel meant when he said to the shepherds that the manger was a "sign" (Luke 2:12)? The second picture shows the point I'm trying to make. Jesus was placed in a manger at His birth, because the manger was a sign, pointing to His death on the cross, the reason He was born.

Triumvirate for Life




