#### My precious sheep:

In this month's issue of the Link, I want to talk about revival! There have been many Christian revivals in American history. The first goes back to the 1700's led by such men as George Whitfield and Jonathan Edwards. This is called the First Great Awakening. The Second Great Awakening happened in the 1800's. There have been notable revivalists in the past 150 years, including such preachers as D. L. Moody, Billy Sunday, and in our time, the late Billy Graham (who was promoted to glory in 2018), who throughout his ministry preached 417 crusades.

Revivals are marked by such features as prayer, confession of sin and deep repentance, the power of the Holy Spirit, and a renewed passion for the Word of God. There are stories of revival in the Bible too. I want us to look at one from the Old Testament book of Nehemiah. We read of it in Nehemiah 8. It was a revival based on the Law of Moses led by Ezra the Priest.

The setting is after the 70-year exile in Babylon. The Jewish people have returned to the Promised Land, that is, to the region of Judah and the city Jerusalem. They have rebuilt the Temple and now (in the story) they have rebuilt the Walls around the city. It looks good on the outside. But now the people of God must look good on the inside. We at CCC have a new building which looks nice physically. Let us concentrate on spiritual rebuilding.

I encourage you to read Nehemiah 8:1-18 on your own. I want to highlight some principles from it which speak powerfully to us to bring revival in our day. The first thing we read is that all the people came together "AS ONE" (Neh 8:1). There was unity among God's people. Oh, how terribly is the church divided today, both within (each congregation) and without (by the many denominations and schisms)! May we be humbled to be unified around God's Word.

#### CONT'D...

They were unified around such. The people actually TOLD Ezra TO BRING OUT God's Word to them (8:1)! I honestly cannot imagine this. It seems that many people today want everything but God's Word brought to them – they want stories, anecdotes, jokes, and a little Bible mixed in. People want pop psychology. They want prosperity gospel. Some want politics. As your pastor, please TELL me to bring you God's Word; for, I am under solemn charge to preach it (2 Tim 4:1-2).

These Israelites were also willing to experience discomfort to hear God's Word. We read in Neh 8:3 that they listened to Ezra simply read it "from daybreak till noon," and they stood for the reading of it (8:5). They willingly listened for several hours. And today people complain about sermons being too long. People will set aside many hours to do leisure activities which they enjoy; but they won't devote the same amount of time to the hearing and understanding of God's Word. Yet, the Apostle Peter commands us to CRAVE the milk of God's Word (1 Pet 2:2).

These Israelites sought to understand the Word. This is emphasized throughout (8:1, 2, 8, 12). Do you, O Christian, seek to understand God's Word? I'm concerned that some people come to worship on Sunday morning out of emotion. They want the sermon to make them feel good on the inside, without putting their mind to use, serious use. The first and greatest commandment in the Bible, Jesus says, is to LOVE God – and we are told to love Him with all of our being – even to love God with our MIND (Mark 12:30).



"The LORD is my light and my salvation – whom shall I fear?
The LORD is the stronghold of my life – of whom shall I be afraid?" Psalm 27:1

But there is a danger here. Some Christians learn the Bible so well that it only stays in their mind; it never reaches their heart, much less their hands and their feet! Some conservative Bible churches focus on doctrine too much that they become modern day Pharisees. Some doctrine is essential, and heresy is real – AND the Bible teaches that "faith without works is dead" (James 2:14-26). These Israelites under Ezra's revival learned the Word of God for one purpose: to OBEY it (Nehemiah 8:16-18).

Let all of us at CCC welcome a revival of the Word of God! Currently, we are providing several Bible studies and small groups for those in our church to learn and understand God's Word and to live it as obedient disciples of Jesus our Lord. If you're not part of one yet, please join a study (see the bulletin and website for details). In addition to God's Word, let us PRAY for revival! That's what the Israelites did next, according to Nehemiah 9. We pray every Sunday at 9am.

Let us rejoice in the gift of the cross. Let us proclaim the risen Lord For with God's grace, no life is lost.


Once again we are redeemed on that old rugged cross, where Christ paid the price for us. God had sent His Son, to reach the lost.
