My precious sheep:

I like to share with people my experience working at Kroger supermarket back in Indiana. I worked at Kroger from 1993-2003. I worked there part-time while I was attending college and seminary. I worked at the front-desk. The front-desk was the place where we took all the complaints. I received many complaints in my ten years working there. Here's how it often transpired: a customer would approach my window upset and begin venting their frustrations at me about some employee or product in the store. Sometimes, it got pretty heated. But I knew I couldn't react angrily in return - both because I was a Christian and because I didn't want to lose my job! I knew Proverbs 15:1 and I would seek to implement this verse in my interactions with angry customers. Proverbs 15:1 says, "A gentle answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger." Thus, I would attempt to respond in gentleness. I would listen to what they had to say, gently affirm their complaint and apologize, and offer some incentive to mollify their anger. Most times (not always) it worked; the customer would calm down and sometimes even apologize to me for being so angry. The truth of the Bible works in real life!

For this month's issue of the Link I want to talk about gentleness. Do you know that gentleness is an important Christian virtue? It is one of the fruits of the Holy Spirit (Gal 5:23). What is gentleness? Gentleness (or meekness) is kind, restrained speech and behavior toward others. The opposite of gentleness is anger and a lack of self-control. Gentleness means soft. But don't mistake this meekness for weakness. Proverbs 16:32 puts it this way, "Better a patient person than a warrior, one with self-control than one who takes a city." Gentleness is true strength.


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Jesus was gentle. Jesus says of Himself in Matthew 11:29, "Take My yoke upon you and learn from Me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls." Jesus is gentle and humble in heart. The heart is what matters most (remember Mark 7:20-23). When we are gentle and humble in heart, it will come out in our words and actions. Then we will find true rest for our souls. When we're angry and arguing and fighting with people, there's no rest in our souls. Gentleness brings rest.

It is important that we maintain a Spirit of gentleness as Christians. This, I believe, is one way that we can be salt and light to our culture (Matt 5:13-16). We should be counter-cultural. Would anyone say that gentleness characterizes our culture these days? No! The opposite is true. Now as a Christian, I certainly believe in truth, and moral absolutes, and that we should hold to these resolutely. Yet, the Bible repeatedly urges us to speak to our opponents in gentleness. This extends to all of our interactions — with family, friends, co-workers, in the church, and on social media. Consider two more powerful biblical passages on gentleness.

The first is Hebrews 5:2. The context is about how church leaders should interact with others. It reads, "He (the church leader) is able to deal gently with those who are ignorant and are going astray, since he himself is subject to weakness." Do you know anyone whom you would label "ignorant?" In today's world I imagine we could produce a long list of names. The Bible says deal with that person gently.



"The LORD is my light and my salvation – whom shall I fear?
The LORD is the stronghold of my life – of whom shall I be afraid?" Psalm 27:1

The second text is 2 Timothy 2:24-26. It reads, "And the Lord's servant must not be quarrelsome but must be kind to everyone, able to teach, not resentful. Opponents must be GENTLY instructed, in the hope that God will grant them repentance leading them to a knowledge of the truth, and that they will come to their senses and escape from the trap of the devil, who has taken them captive to do his will." Look at some of these phrases. Opponents of Christianity are under the trap of the devil, taken captive to do his will (the devil is called "the god of this age" in 2 Cor 4:4), not in their right senses. I think this ought to generate some empathy in us for our opponents. We should pray that God will grant them repentance.

Gentleness is not easy; but it's not impossible. Pray that the Holy Spirit would ripen His fruit of gentleness within you, and over time you can grow in this virtue. Remember the second part of our mission and vision is GROW ("growing spiritually").
