PASTOR JAMES W. CARLSON

My precious sheep:

I ran cross-country and track in high school. I was a runner. I was pretty good. I remember the ending to one particular race on the track. It was the 3,200. That is two miles (8x around the track). I was on the last leg of the race. It was a close ending! I was in the lead; but there was another guy not far behind me, who was gaining as we neared the finish line. I started to look over my shoulder. But that slowed me down. He was getting closer. The crowd was excited. I focused intently on the finish line ahead of me, and I won the race. It was exhilarating!

Running a race is one of the metaphors for the Christian life in the Bible. Too often we get slowed down because we look back. We are overcome with regrets. Mistakes. Sins. We believe (in theory) that God forgives, but I think we have a hard time forgiving ourselves. Do you have regrets from 2021? Do you look back and wish you hadn't sinned this way or that way? I want to share a paragraph of Scripture to encourage you not to look back with regrets on 2021 (or any other year prior) but to focus on 2022 ahead.

The Scripture is **Philippians 3:12-14**. Paul the Apostle begins in **Philippians 3:12** by saying, "Not that I have already obtained this or am already perfect, but I press on to take hold of that for which Christ Jesus took hold of me." In context, Paul is speaking of his own spiritual growth and maturity. He acknowledges that he's not there yet; he acknowledges that he's not perfect. Sometimes we excuse our sin by saying, "Nobody's perfect." That's not what Paul means. He's simply acknowledging in humility that there's always room for more growth.



Notice carefully his motivation for growth according to this verse. It's not guilt. It's not shame. Paul of all people could have been paralyzed by these emotions – because he literally killed Christians! He says, "I press on to TAKE HOLD of that for which Christ Jesus TOOK HOLD of me." Jesus is already at the finish line. He's waiting for us there. And He has a hold of us, and He will never let go! Jesus Himself says in **John 10:28**, "I give them eternal life, and they will never perish, and NO ONE WILL SNATCH THEM OUT OF MY HAND." His grip on us is tight.

Next, in Philippians 3:13 Paul writes, "Brothers and sisters, I do not consider myself yet to have taken hold of it. But one thing I do: Forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead." Paul says: ONE thing I do. That's an important phrase in the Bible. To the anxious and worried Martha Jesus said, "ONE thing is necessary" (Luke 10:42). In Psalm 27:4 David writes, "ONE thing have I asked of the LORD, that will I seek after: that I may dwell in the house of the LORD all the days of my life, to gaze upon the beauty of the LORD and to inquire in His temple." Our problem is we want "many things" when the secret to progress is to focus on the "one thing." We should devote ourselves to running the Christian race. No athlete succeeds by doing everything; they succeed by specializing in their sport. The winners are those who concentrate, keep their eyes on the goal, and let nothing distract them. They are devoted entirely to their calling. And they don't look back.



"The LORD is my light and my salvation – whom shall I fear?
The LORD is the stronghold of my life – of whom shall I be afraid?" Psalm 27:1

Imagine if a runner on a track constantly kept looking back. What would happen? They might trip or fall. And that's what happens to us when we dwell on our past sins. We get tripped up and we don't make progress. We all have regrets. But what Paul is saying is: Don't let the past define you. Instead, we are encouraged to be "forgetting what lies behind." That doesn't mean we are able to completely erase all our bad memories. That's impossible. "To forget" in the Bible means: "to be no longer influenced by or affected by." It means we break the power of the past by living for the future.

Lastly, Paul writes in **Philippians 3:14**, "I PRESS ON toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus." Twice in this passage Paul says, "I press on," meaning, "I'm not where I want to be, but I'm going to keep moving in that direction." Direction makes all the difference. We Christians are not in heaven yet, but we aim our steps in that direction. And we are determined. The Greek word for "press on" has the idea of intense endeavor. In our spiritual life we are as determined as an athlete who desires to win their event. Wouldn't it be wonderful if some Christians put as much determination into their spiritual life as they do golfing, fishing, or bowling? Following Jesus Christ is not a hobby—like collecting stamps or comic books. It demands a total commitment of life!

We CAN make progress. Don't be fooled into believing we can't. Don't dwell on the past. God has forgiven you in Christ. I know it's harder to forgive yourself. But just think of all the good you could do for God and others if you would just forgive yourself. You HAVE a future. Heaven is the finish line. Jesus is waiting there for you. He's cheering you on (along with the cloud of witnesses from **Hebrews 11**). Let's make Him proud in 2022. Let us press onward Christian soldiers!


LOVE'S GIFT
