PASTOR JAMES W. CARLSON

My precious sheep:

"You had me at Hello." Do you recognize this famous line from the movie, "Jerry Maguire (1996)?" It stars Tom Cruise and Renée Zellweger. In the movie they are married but separated. At the end, Tom Cruise's character apologizes and wants to get back together. He gives a lengthy speech to win her back but before he can finish, she interrupts and says, "You had me at Hello." A while back I was determined to read 1 Corinthians chaps 1-4 in my devotions. This is the first major section of the letter. But as I started reading, I didn't even get past v. 2. V. 2 is part of Paul's greeting to the church and it stopped me dead in my tracks. God had me at Hello.

I want to share this verse with you, and I hope you'll be blessed as I was. 1 Corinthians 1:2 reads, "To the church of God in Corinth, to those sanctified in Christ Jesus and called to be His holy people, together with all those everywhere who call on the name of our Lord Jesus Christ – their Lord and ours."

There are a few things that stand out to me in this verse. The first is our identity as Christians. Paul says the church is made up of those who are "sanctified in Christ Jesus." Sanctified is a fancy word that means to declare holy. As Christians, we are holy. It's not our holiness; it is the Lord's holiness that has been given to us as a gift (received by faith). That's what he means when he says, "sanctified in Christ Jesus." This should be a great comfort/encouragement to us.


Awareness gradually perceives the approaching images

CONT'D...

Let's face it: We don't always feel holy. We don't always live holy lives. We all struggle with sin. We all have strongholds in our lives. Yet, our holiness, like our salvation, is secure in Christ because it is IN Christ. This truth of our holiness in Christ is taught elsewhere in the NT (see 1 Cor 1:30; 6:11; Col 1:22; 3:12; Eph 5:26-27).

And when you realize Paul originally wrote these words to the church in Corinth, that's even more encouraging. The Corinthian church had issues. They could have been on an episode of Jerry Springer. They were quarreling with one another (1:10-12; 3:1-4). They were suing one another in the secular courts (6:1-8). Some of them were seeing prostitutes (6:15-20). And one guy was sleeping with his mother-in-law and the church was boasting about it (5:1-13)! Yet, Paul says they are "sanctified in Christ Jesus." If that's true for the Corinthians, there's hope for us.



"The LORD is my light and my salvation – whom shall I fear?

The LORD is the stronghold of my life – of whom shall I be afraid?" Psalm 27:1

That's secondary for we Christians. No matter what you do for a living, or no matter what you're good at (or not), your fundamental calling as a Christ-follower is to live a holy life. And when you mess up (again, as we all do), don't be discouraged, because your holiness in Christ is still secure. This identity is where we find the power to live a holy life. That's the difference between living under grace and not law (Rom 6:14-15).

Thirdly, we can be certain that Paul means to apply these truths to us today, for he writes, "together with ALL those EVERYWHERE who call on the name of our Lord Jesus Christ – THEIR Lord and ours." Do you need help to live a holy life? Are you not sure who to call? Not 911. Call on the Lord to help you live a holy life. He will answer that call.
